

Sabbatical Election Results

'I wouldn't say I'm devastated that I lost, but I am pretty upset about it,' said Angelo Gardini, as he blundered his way towards the bar after the announcement of the 1992 sabbatical election results.

After voting in all departments on Monday and Tuesday, the counting of ballot papers began at 6.30pm last night. When the results were announced at 9.43pm, Chris Davidson had been elected President, Rick Bilby had been elected Deputy President, and Jonty Beavan had been elected Felix Editor.

The shock of the evening was the first ever victory for New Election as Honorary Secretary (Events). This is only the second election that New Election has won. In 1990, New Election was elected to the post of Deputy President, something that had been suggested for this year.

Chris Davidson, elected President on the back of the St. Mary's vote, thanked everyone who voted for him, and to everyone who helped out. The disproportionate influence of the St. Mary's block vote was also shown in the Deputy President and Honorary Secretary (Events) elections. Its effect was less marked in the election for Felix Editor, where it combined with the Departments of Computing, Mathematics and Physics vote to help push Jonty Beavan over the quota on the first count.

Aled Fenner, former Honorary Secretary (Events) candidate, blamed the St. Mary's block vote for the victory of New Election. 'The Mary's vote basically put us out, both of us they don't really care anything about Imperial', hetold iCNN in the Union Bar after the announcement.

Both Aled Fenner and Nick Allen have declared their intention to stand again for Honorary Secretary. Phil Sharp, defeated Deputy Presidential candidate, also declared his candidature. 'Me and Angelo are standing as joint candidates ... we're standing on the campaign of 'we'll do fuck all', so we think we'll get elected.' There was speculation last night that DramSoc may also propose an Honorary Secretary candidate. Current ICU President, Zoë Hellinger, said, 'it's a shame about the Hon. Sec. new election'.

Rick Bilby, Deputy President-Elect, announced himself 'well pleased for the result. All the hard work I put in paid off'. Jonty Beavan, next year's Felix editor, said he was very happy with the result. Jonty thanked his colleague and fellow candidate, Toby Jones, for running 'a very gentlemanly campaign', adding 'it's a great shame he (Toby) lost'.

Absent from the declaration was Anthony Baldwin, who failed to surface during the whole campaign. His proposer, Bruce Hall, said that his campaign 'was to try to bring into stark contrast the election system', and that Baldwin's campaign was designed to give an opportunity to 'people who wanted to vote against the way the union is being run at the present.' Those who were unhappy with the election expressed their dissatisfaction both inside and outside the ballot box. On a 17% turnout, over 10% of votes cast were spoiled. Whether this expresses frustration with the Union or unfamiliarity with the STV voting system used has yet to be revealed. *(iCNN)*.

all cases bar Felix editor this may have been because of the complete lack of character and organisation of the candidates rather than because of any particular policy. Secondly, my commiserations to those who lost and congratulations to the winners - at least they had the get up and go to get involved. Shame they couldn't have done it earlier rather than when they suddenly found out they had no job next year, but no matter.

It seems that the candidates for Honorary Secretary - Aled Fenner and Nick Allen - must have observed what the present incumbent has been up to and decided it was quite a good doss for a year. This is the appearance they gave - if you treat the job like a joke, the electorate treat you like a joke. This Union tends to go in boom-and-bust cycles; years when the Sabbs take control and shake the Union into some semblance of efficiency and years when there is no effective rudder and control is left to the clubs and societies. Last year, under Paul Shanley and Ben Turner, and the year before under Neil McCluskey, the Union was run. This year it has drifted, under

a Deputy President who nobody knows, a democratically elected student representative President who patently doesn't know what democracy entails and an Hon Sec who has been seriously underworked. And a Print Unit Manager who has decided the best way to manage it is by doing the absolute minimum print unit work, who is also a Felix editor suffering the delusion that leaving the Union office alone will improve relations. Well, bang goes that. So I'm being negative - believe me, this Union deserves it. It claims to represent IC students, and is often pitted against the twin monsters of College and Government, both highly professional and powerful organisations, and it is failing. Under the present system it is not working for students and it is my job to point it out. Perhaps I should have done it earlier. Perhaps I would have been accused of not giving the Union a 'chance.'

The Union Office Sabb winners - Rick Bilby and Chris Davidson did not exactly make their name known in College or Union circles before standing. I had never heard of them before - and most things

eventually reach the Felix Office. I sincerely wish them all the best and I cannot stress too strongly that they should immediately start looking into the Union and formulate ideas about how it should be improved. But don't fail your degree, for God's sake. I am not terribly hopeful about their chances of success - but I should leave that to my successor, in whom, I have to say, I have great confidence. He is basically two faced, devious and nasty.

Get rid of sabbaticals and get some professional staff in. It's the only way you are going to get guaranteed quality of service. There will be another issue of Felix next Wednesday, 18th March.
